'Love, Dharma and Peace' is the motto of Holy Family International School. The school encourages the students to practice charity in a world vitiated by selfishness and individualism. Dharma underlines the importance of moral values for a contented life. Peace is the fruit of the practice of love and dharma.

#### **VISION**

The vision of Holy Family International School is to contribute towards the progress and well being of individuals and society through the pursuit of education and research at the highest international levels of excellence.

#### **MISSION**

Holy Family International School strives to mould each student into a well-integrated person intellectually developed, emotionally intelligent, physically sound, morally upright, socially concerned and spiritually motivated so that a student may become a responsible citizen of India with a universal outlook.

#### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Holy Family International School is owned by the Diocese of Kanjirapally. The objective of the school is to provide sound education designed for the allround development of the child. In other words, we prepare the pupils to face the challenges of tomorrow and to enable them to develop into better minds, hearts, physique and to attain intellectual, moral, ethical and social excellence. Special emphasis is laid on the natural virtues of truthfulness, honesty, politeness, industry, simplicity and self-discipline.

The pupils are prepared for the Indian Certificate for Secondary Education (ICSE) Examination taken at the end of Std X.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- 1) A sense of discipline and respect for rules have to be inculcated and cultivated in the students in their school days so that they may grow into a disciplined citizen. A strict observance of the rules and regulations of the school helps them in this regard. So the rules and regulations have to be looked upon not as restrictions imposed on them but as part of their school life that helps them in the formation of genuine character. All the school activities are directed towards this end.
- 2) A student of Holy Family International School is expected:
  - a) To observe faithfully the rules of discipline and obey all authorities;
  - b) To develop healthy habits of mind and body by constant self discipline;
  - c) To acquire qualities of leadership and competency in the art of expression and persuasion;
  - d) To strive to be gentle and learn to serve and be helpful to others:
  - e) To be friendly and courteous to all visitors;

- f) To be truthful and honest whatever be the cost;
- g) To be respectful to his/her parents and elders;
- h) To have a sense of neatness and cleanliness of himself/herself and surroundings.
- 3. The medium of instruction is English and students are expected to communicate in English at all times.
- 4. Attend school regularly and be on time to school and to the class.
- 5. Come neatly dressed in the proper school uniform.
- 6. It is compulsory to wear the school issued ID card to school everyday. Not bringing the ID card could result in the child not being allowed into the School premises.
- 7. The students should be inside the school campus at least 5 minutes before the first bell. Strict action will be taken against students frequently coming late.
- 8. Be respectful and courteous to fellow students, parents, guardians, teaching and non-teaching staff.
- 9. Do school work and homework neatly and completely.
- 10. Students celebrating their birthday are permitted to distribute candy/chocolates only.
- 11. Students will refrain from damaging any form of school property. The school reserves the right to be compensated by the student for any such damages.
- 12. Students will refrain from littering and keep the school premises clean.
- 13. Any form of bulling, ragging, verbal or physical fights will result in a disciplinary committee review and could result in suspension/expulsion.
- 14. Parents can meet teachers only during Parent Teacher Meetings and Meeting teachers during school hours is strictly prohibited.
- 15. The school reserves the right to search the school bag of any student at any time.

#### **DISCIPLINARY RULES**

- 1) Textbooks and notebooks according to the timetable of the day must be brought to the class.
- 2) No newspapers, periodicals, comics, magazines, toys, mobile phones other electronics items etc. are to be brought to the school without the permission of the Principal.
- 3) Students must speak English in the campus.
- 4) Students should bring their handbook to school everyday.
- 5) Students should not bring to school cash, electronic items any costly ornaments for the safety of which neither the Management nor the teachers will be held responsible.
- 6) During recess and play time students should not go out of the school campus. They should avoid all kinds of eatables which are unhygienic but attractive and easily available. Please keep in mind that such eatables are injurious to health.
- 7) Students should never forget to greet the teachers and elders saying 'good morning or good afternoon' as the case may be. They should also greet one another.
- 8) If the teacher has not come to the class at the start of a period, the class leader should see to the discipline of the class. If the teacher does not come even after three minutes the class leaders should report the matter to the Principal.
- 9) Students should see that no damage is done to the school property. They should not write on, or deface the walls, furniture, laboratory apparatus, musical instruments and library books. Those who cause such damage will be liable to repair it at their own expenses.
- 10) Any exchange of articles or money transaction between students is not allowed. No collection of any sort is to be made without the prior permission of the Principal.

- 11) Although every care will be taken of a pupil's property, the school does not hold itself responsible for any theft, damage or loss of it. However, students are supposed to contact the office to report the loss and to reclaim their lost property, if obtained in the office.
- 12) If anybody finds any lost article anywhere on the campus or outside, it should be handed over to the office as it is the duty of a good student.
- 13) Students shall wear their school uniform on all working days except on the days granted by the Principal.

Fine will be charged for the loss/damage of ID card, Belt, and Any Badge of recognition that are given from the school. Also the students are liable to meet the cost of new identity card in case of loss/damage of the same.

#### ADMISSION, PROMOTION AND WITHDRAWAL

- Admission to the school is restricted by certain Government regulations and by conditions of age, ability and conduct. Hence applications for admission will be processed and candidate will be rated and admitted to the classes they deserve.
- New students must be introduced personally by their parents or guardians who will be responsible to the school authorities for their conduct, regularity and payment of fees.
- 3) The Principal reserves the right to reject any application without having to assign reasons for his action.
- 4) Promotions may depend upon the general progress of the student during the academic year and not merely on the result of the annual examination. The basis of promotion declared by the authorities will be strictly adhered to. Attendance is also a major criterion for promotion.

5) Records of internal assessments, average attendance and directions from the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations are also taken into account in the matter of promotion.

#### LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- As regular attendance is an important element for successful school work, no student should absent himself/herself from class without serious reason.
- 2) Grant of leave for a part of the day must be obtained from the Principal by a written application from the parent or guardian stating clearly the reasons on the LEAVE APPLICATION page of the Handbook.
- 3) Those who return to school after absenting themselves without due leave shall not enter the class without the expressed permission based on the leave-note of the parents written on the LEAVE APPLICATION page of the handbook.
- 4) In the case of long illness, the Principal must be informed in writing within eight days. In such cases a separate leave application from the parent with a medical certificate has to be produced on the first day of the return of the student to the school after his/her illness.
- 5) Repeated or extended absence of fifteen days without leave of absence may forfeit the right of the students to continue in the institution. Re-admission, if granted, will be only be after payment of fresh admission fees.
- 6) Students who absent themselves from any of the terminal examinations for any reason other than sickness justified by a medical certificate, will be considered having failed for the particular examination. (unless the student appears for another similar examination at the discretion of the Principal.)

#### **FEE**

- School fees can be paid as four instalments.
   Details are given in the page 31
- 2) After the due date on the fees the defaulters will have to pay the fees only with fine. The fine may vary in proportion to the delay in paying the fees.
- 3) Those who do not clear all the dues for the term will not be allowed to appear for the examination.

#### FEES CONCESSION

Over the years, the school has been very generous in giving fees concession to the deserving students as and when required. However, request for fees concession/exemption has to be renewed every year without fail in order to avail the facility. All such provision will stand cancelled unless the renewal of the same is not done within one month of the beginning of the academic year. Please note that a mere submission of application will not ensure any such concession but is subjected to the discretion and approval of the management.

The following documents are to be submitted to the school MANAGER to avail fees concession/exemption of any kind.

- 1. Hand written application letter
- 2. Duly filled application form received from the office
- 3. Copy of Aadhar Card
- 4. Recommendation from any of the following
  - a. Parish Priest
  - b. Respective religious or community leader
  - c. Ward Member
  - d. Any elected representative of the state

#### RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE PARENTS

- 1) Parents are expected to do their part in inculcating regular work and study habits in the children. They should see that their children prepare their lessons according to a timetable set at home.
- 2) Make sure that your wards are not wasting away their valuable time by merely watching T.V. on holidays and working days. Encourage them to watch only those programmes which are informative and illustrative.
- 3) Parents are informed that regularly teachers are likely to send reports, messages and SMS. Progress reports are issued after each examination. Please sign such reports and check the messages and SMS in your cellphone and the Hand book in time.
- 4) Communications and suggestions for improvements are most welcome. But such communications are to be given or sent only to the Principal and not to the teachers.
- 5) In urgent situations if a student needs to be sent home for a session or a period early, parents should approach the Principal with a written request for the same on the LEAVE/ABSENCE RECORD page of the Handbook.
- 6) Withdrawal of your child from the class for mere social functions is not recommended, because it retards the child's progress in school and minimizes his/her respect for regularity and hard work, with consequent failure to make progress in his/her studies.
- 7) Parents or guardians are always welcome to the school to check the progress of their children, but without disturbing the normal schedule of the school activities.
- 8) Parents or guardians are not expected to walk along corridors and hall ways nor are they expected to meet and talk to the teachers and students. If anybody wants to meet a child or a staff member during class time for any urgent matter, let them approach the Principal for help.

- 9) Criticism of the teachers or of the school in the presence of the children must be totally avoided because it causes them to lose respect for his/her teachers with the consequent failure to learn from the teacher.
- 10) Students who are suffering from any infectious disease are not to be sent to the school before complete cure and convalescence.
- 11) Cleanliness is next to godliness. Children must be clean in their habits and neatly dressed. Parents are requested to see that the children leave their homes in full decorum.

#### **SCHOOL LIBRARY**

- The school has a well equipped and computerized library and a reading room. A period in a week is allotted to each class for the use of the library.
- 2) Reference books, periodicals and journals should not be taken out of the reading- room. Students can borrow only one book at a time and may retain it only for a period of one week. Books borrowed are non-transferable.
- 3) A fine of Rs.5/- for a week and Re.1/- per day will be charged for those who do not return books on time.
- 4) Borrowers should report any damage, loss of pages, pictures, etc., to the librarian before they accept the books. If any book is lost, damaged or badly handled, the double price or a new copy of the book should be submitted.
- 5) Strict silence should be maintained inside the library. The school library will be opened from 9.15 am to 4.30 pm from Monday to Friday.

#### CO-CURRICULAR AND CLUB ACTIVITIES

1) To develop the varied interests and different talents of the pupils, we provide ample opportunity, through several co-curricular activities. Besides formal training, the students are given

- opportunity to get involved in artistic, cultural and social activities through various associations and clubs.
- 2) Participation in the co-curricular activities and membership in any one of the clubs are compulsory.

#### GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

- 1) The school has a Guidance and Counselling Cell which enables to modify and to enhance the psychological well-being of the pupils. It also helps the students who are disturbed psychologically, socially, emotionally or situationally. Unless and until the student is able to manage the emotional disturbances, his/her studies will be affected. Guidance and counselling cell provides systematic ways of helping the students learn the personality adjustments.
- 2) It is desirable for the parents to make use of the service of the Guidance and Counselling Cell. Parents are requested to obtain prior appointment for this purpose.

- Irregularity in attendance, habitual idleness, dis- obedience or defiance of authority, lack of sufficient improvement in conduct and studies even after warnings for amelioration are sufficient reasons for the dismissal of a student.

- 3) No leaving certificate is issued unless the parents make request in writing. One month's notice of the withdrawals is required. No leaving certificate will be issued until all the fees and dues have been paid.

#### CRITERIA FOR THE PROFICIENCY AWARD

Following criteria will be applied while calculating for the award of Proficiency in an academic year

- 1. Aggregate marks of the three written examinations alone will be considered for the award
- 2. Students should have above 90% attendance






